HISPANIC HERITAGE ART EXHIBITION ILLUSTRATES POSITIVE CONTRIBUTIONS TO AMERICAN SOCIETY

Public Can Visit National Hispanic Heritage Month Art Exhibition September 15 through October 31

Stamford, CT, August 25, 2007 – In recognition of the artistic contributions made by Hispanic Americans, “Arte con Color Latino,” Fairfield County’s National Hispanic Heritage Month Art Exhibition will officially open on September 15 through October 31 at the Stamford Center for the Arts.

The exhibition, curated by Picture That, LLC, a fine art consulting practice based in Stamford, features works by local, regional and international artists who represent the countries of Cuba, Colombia, Dominican Republic, Mexico, Puerto Rico, Spain and Venezuela. The warmth and vitality of “Arte con Color Latino” demonstrates how Hispanic American art has enriched the fabric of our country and our communities.

The exhibition will be available to the public for viewing in the Richard and Hinda Rosenthal Gallery of the Rich Forum located at 307 Atlantic Street in downtown Stamford from 10 AM to 6 PM, Monday through Saturday and Sunday from Noon to 5 PM. A portion of the exhibition will also be available to the public for viewing in the Sackler Gallery of the Palace Theatre at 61 Atlantic Street and at the corporate headquarters of General Electric by appointment only.

An opening art reception for “Arte con Color Latino” will be held on Thursday, September 27 from 6 PM to 8 PM in the Rosenthal Gallery of the Rich Forum. This county-wide event is free and open to the public. Festivities at the reception will include Latin music and dance, and authentic Latin food donated and served by local Hispanic restaurants.

In addition to featuring professional works of art, a Student Visual Arts and Literacy Exhibition will be on display that will highlight the different cultures representative of the 21 Spanish-Speaking countries in the world. Students in grades K-12 from Darien, Greenwich, New Canaan, Norwalk and Stamford Public Schools have been invited to participate.
