Fairfield County African American Art Exhibition Opens February 6, 2009

"Renewing America: Pictures of Promise" Commemorates Black History Month and NAACP Centennial

Stamford, CT - In many respects Black History Month takes on new meaning in 2009--with a historic Presidential inauguration setting the stage, and the 100th anniversary of the founding of the NAACP serving as symbolic anchor to this annual celebration.

In recognition of a legacy rich in struggle and triumph, Picture That, LLC presents **"Renewing America: Pictures of Promise**", Fairfield County's 2009 African American Art Exhibition. More than 70 works of art depicting various aspects of African American life, history, and culture will be on display at the University of Connecticut (UCONN) Art Gallery in Stamford, CT, from February 6 – February 28, 2009.

The exhibit will feature "The 3rd Eye", a collection of works that focus on the reality of life's circle through mixed media, photography, fiber art and sculpture. Participating regional artists include Natalie Alleyne (Bloomfield, NJ), Margo Candelario (Atlanta, GA), Jerry Craft (Norwalk, CT) and Barry Mason (Mount Vernon, NY).

In addition, photographs from the Scurlock Studio Collection will be on display, courtesy of the Smithsonian Institution's Archive Center. The Scurlock images portray a vivid documentation of 20th Century black society in the nation's capital, and are a part the Smithsonian's Black History Month exhibit at the National Museum of African-American History and Culture Gallery in Washington, DC. The DC-based exhibit is entitled "Scurlock Studio and Black Washington: Picture the Promise" and will run from Jan. 30 – Nov 10, 2009.

Together, these bodies of work create a compelling and sweeping portrait of Black America.

UCONN Gallery hours are Monday – Thursday, 9AM – 7PM, Friday until 5PM and Saturday until 1PM. A portion of the exhibition is also installed at General Electric's Cultural Fine Art Gallery and can be viewed online <u>www.picture-that.com/gegallery/africanamerican</u> beginning Martin Luther King, Jr. Day, January 19, 2009.

To officially open the exhibition, a community reception and guided tour by George Scurlock of Hartford, CT, a descendant of the Scurlock family, will be held on Thursday, February 12th— which also marks the NAACP Centennial—at UCONN Art Gallery, One University Place, Stamford, CT, from 5PM to 8PM. To close the celebratory month, a student reception featuring artwork depicting a "Renewed America" will be held on Saturday, February 28 from 11AM to 1PM at The Stamford Center for the Arts Rich Forum Rosenthal Gallery. Students from the Stamford, Darien, Norwalk and Greenwich school systems will display art and read passages about their particular works during this multicultural event which is sponsored by the Nellie Mae Education Foundation. "They work hard creating artwork and then researching and writing passages around our pre-defined themes", said Valerie Cooper, President of Picture That, LLC.

Exposing children to fine art and the history of cultures is a mission for Ms. Cooper. "This is my volunteerism. This gives students from all cultural backgrounds an opportunity to see their work alongside a professional's and know that the fine art world does not have high barriers to entry.
